## What is a Sacrament and where did they originate?

### Do you know what the seven Sacraments are?

#### What is Sacrament?

Sacraments are the means which God uses to show His grace and help us achieve salvation. The word sacrament means “a sign of the sacred,” which is fitting as they are all outward signs from God to us. Not only are they signs, they’re also celebrations of a continued journey and relationship with God, teaching to help live out His word and ceremonies to show devotion to Him.

#### Where did the Sacraments originate?

Christ gave his followers clear instructions on how to administer and receive each of the Sacraments in the Bible. This is seen through his work with the Apostles, healing the sick, teaching in parables, giving his Body and Blood to nourish our souls and forgiving sinners. The Church administers these holy Sacraments as instructed, in order for all to worship God and receive his salvation.

#### The Sacraments of Initiation

The three Sacraments of initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Each is meant to strengthen your faith and forge a deeper relationship with God.

##### Baptism

The first Sacrament where you become united with Christ and the Church. No other Sacrament can be received without it. Baptism frees you from original sin.

Galatians 3:27 *“For all of you who have been baptized into Christ have clothed yourself with Christ.”*

Mathew 28:19 *“Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.”*

##### Confirmation

Confirmation strengthens your faith. Confirmands acknowledge that they want to continue their journey with God and grow their relationship with Him.

John 20:22 *“And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, Receive the Holy Spirit.”*

Joshua 1:9 *“Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.”*

##### Eucharist

Eucharist allows you to taste the Body and Blood of

eternal life and be reminded of Christ’s love and sacrifice. Eucharist means thanksgiving. Food and drink nourishes our bodies, Christ’s Blood and Body nourishes us spiritually.

John 6:35 *“Jesus said to them, I am the bread of life; he who comes to me will not hunger, and he who believes in me will never thirst.”*

Matthew 26:26-28 *“While they were eating Jesus took some bread, and after a blessing, He broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, “Take, eat; this is My body.” And when He had taken a cup and given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, “Drink from it, all of you; for this is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for forgiveness of sins.”*

#### The Sacraments of Healing

The sacraments of healing are penance or reconciliation, and anointing the sick.

##### Penance

The confession of sins to God through a priest who forgives our sins by God’s mercy, and orders us to live a more faithful life through absolution. This helps us to have a stronger relationship with God.

James 5:16 *“Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.”*

Proverbs 28:13 *“Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy.”*

##### Anointing of the Sick

This sacrament is only bestowed upon those who are seriously ill or suffering, which then unites the afflicted with Christ’s passion. This special blessing is one way to make the ill feel strengthened and more connected with God in both mind and body.

Matthew 11:28 *“Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.”*

James 5:14 *“Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord.”*
